1.0 Description

The EWSE air temperature sensors are designed for wall or pipe mounting in harsh indoor or outdoor environments.

A rugged 6mm diameter sheathed RTD probe is housed in the centre of a 14mm dia. outer protection tube. The RTD sensor terminal block or optional transitter are housed in a tough aluminium alloy enclosure, rated to IP65.

An IP68 cable gland is fitted to the left hand side of the enclosure, suitable for cables from 2.5 to 6.5mm diameter.

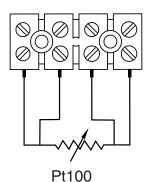
4.0 Mechanical Installation

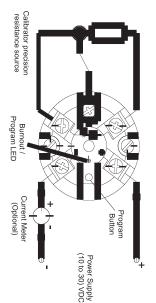


Figure 3 Configuration circuit

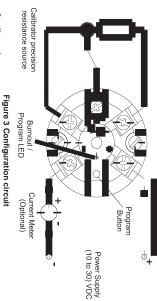
